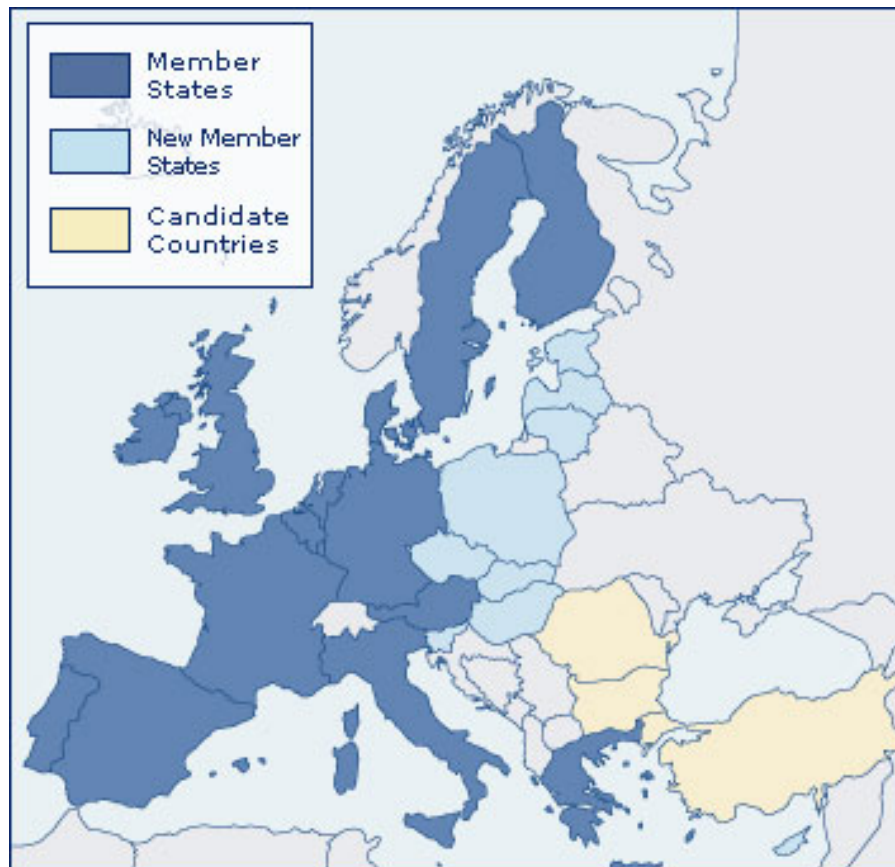

New Member States - Academia

- 2007-2010
- Disseminate knowledge and provide practical training for the wider European Community, particularly new Member States.
 - Training Workshops on tools developed within SABRE
 - Two fully subsidised places for new Member State Scientists on each of these workshops
 - Six short-term inward academic placements for new Member State Scientists to conduct research with existing SABRE partners



New Member States - Industry

- 2007-2010
- Accelerate integration and uptake of new tools and software in new Member States.
 - Four 3-day training workshops on application of scientific developments and new breeding tools and software.
 - SABRE sponsors two places on each workshop for industrial scientists from breeding organisations based in new Member States.



Next 12 months

To be taken up before September 2007

- One short-term placement for scientists from new EU Member states
 - 2-12 weeks
 - Award up to €5,000
- Maximum three fully subsidised places at SABRE-run workshops



INCO-EU Objective

- Help open up the European Research Area to the world
- Activities to focus on benefits for both
 - the Community and its Member States
 - INCO target countries and other third countries.



INCO

- The general objective of international cooperation activities carried out under the current Framework Programme (FP6) is to help open up the European Research Area to the world.
- These activities focus on the mutually beneficial efforts of the Community and its Member States on the one hand and INCO target countries and other third countries on the other.



Scientists from INCO Countries

During the project:

- Six short-term academic exchanges
 - 2-12 weeks
 - Award up to €5,000

OR

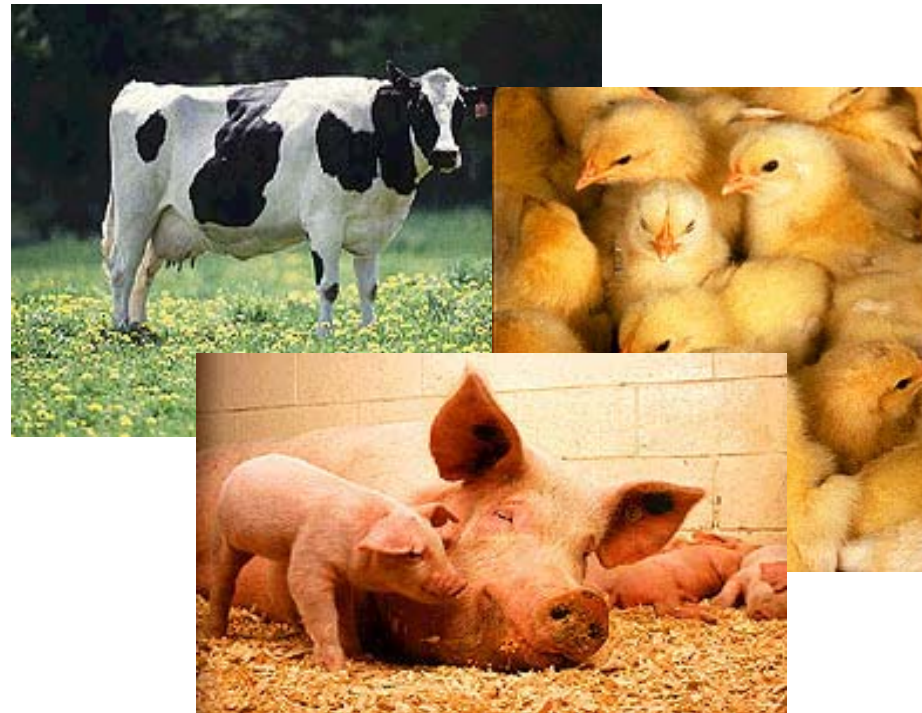
- six fully subsidised workshop place
